

### THE MESSAGE



#### Dear Beloved Children of God,

As we begin the new year, we will spend time in the season of Epiphany. The church celebrates the day of Epiphany on January 6, twelve days after Christmas. The church recalls the story of the wise men who came from the East searching for a king born under a star. They met with King Herod in Jerusalem and ascertained that a king was to be born in Bethlehem. Herod directed them to continue their search for this new king. "When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road." (Matthew 2:10-12 NRSV)

The wise men risked much and traveled far to pay homage to the king born under a star in Bethlehem. They came offering their gifts, only to be overcome with joy, not grasping that it was Jesus who provides the greater gift to the world. Aha! God was revealed to the wise men!

EPIPHANY: The Season of Aha! - The texts of the Revised Common Lectionary used by churches throughout the world during the Sundays after the Epiphany include wonderful stories of those who (like the wise men) have "Aha!" moments. We experience similar Aha moments when we say, "So that is what God is up to!" as we discover and claim the gifts of discipleship in our baptism. How is Christ made known today?

Each year on the Sunday after January 6 (Epiphany), the church celebrates the baptism of Jesus and hears a clear affirmation of God's love for him, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:17 NRSV) All four gospels describe this significant event in the life of Jesus. In baptism, the Holy Spirit came to Jesus, and His mission on this earth was launched.

In our baptism, we too are claimed as God's beloved children. In our baptism, we too receive the Holy Spirit, transforming our lives and launching our mission. That mission is made known in the gifts of discipleship which we are given and to which we commit our lives as we affirm our baptism.

"In baptism our gracious heavenly Father frees us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; by water and the Holy Spirit we are reborn children of God and made members of the church, the body of Christ. Living with Christ and in the communion of saints, we grow in faith love, and obedience to the will of God."

#### MARILYN'S MESSAGE (CONT'D.)

At baptism, the presiding minister places water upon the person in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized and offers these words, "Child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever."

To be sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever is significant and lifechanging. As we affirm our baptism, we are asked the following question: Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

- to live among God's faithful people,
- to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
- · to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and
- to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Each of us responds: "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me." This response sounds like a New Year's resolution for daily living. This response is not an obligation, but rather a five-fold gift from God. Each gift contains the potential of blessing.

A NW MN Synod Area Missions Conversation

#### Have you heard of Area Mission Conversations (Strategy Tables)?

#### What?

They are Christ-centered gatherings with guided and focused conversations around what God is up to in specific areas. Among many topics, such discussions focus on maximizing the mission and ministry at participating sites and creating opportunities to share ideas, energies, leadership, and resources for Christ's Church. Currently, Pr. Rebel is facilitating an Area Mission Conversation with seven churches in the northwestern Minnesota also known as the Headwaters Collaboration.

#### Why?

The Headwaters Collaboration was created in response to the congregations' needs, including:

- Leadership (both rostered and lay)
- Finding ways to support and respect each congregation's traditions, histories, and identities
- Desiring to collaborate for the sake of the Gospel

Over the last eight months, this team has dreamed, prayed, created, trusted, wondered, implemented, and have been spiritually committed to one another and the health of their congregations.

#### How?

Knowing that every congregation is unique in who they are and where they serve, this process is designed to be flexible and contextual. The mission strategy process helps congregations reclaim their own identity while listening deeply to the community around them. The knowledge gained from intentional listening helps shape a plan for the future. It also provides a foundation for continued discernment about where God is leading them.

Each church will meet with their church council to review their commitment and their next steps. The Headwaters Collaboration will be presented to their congregations during their respective annual meetings. This collaboration is congregation-ally led and it is up to each congregation to determine their desire to move forward. The collaboration will gather at the end of January reporting the feedback from their congregations and will supply two congregants that will serve as liaisons.

Jan. 9 Intro & Chapter 1: "The First Call to Discipleship"


Jan. 16 Chapter 2: "Jesus the Healer"

Ched and his co-authors write: "There are two kinds of stories. One kind of story aspires to entertain and distract its audience. Such stories assume readers who are passive spectators. In North American culture today, we are most familiar with these kinds of stories—Movies, political speeches, and the six o'clock news all maintain an essential distance between the performance and the audience. The other kind of story intends to change the audience. It invites spectators to become "spec-actors" those who are so engaged by a story that they want to become a part of it. The Gospel According to Mark is that kind of story. It beckons readers to "have ears to hear" and

to "see" and "follow." This book invites readers into a process of reflecting on Mark's gospel, a process we believe can become a journey of transformation. We, as authors, believe in the power of Mark's story of Jesus to turn spectators into spec-actors."
